Sir,

I am directed to convey the administrative approval of the competent authority to the continuance of the Scheme 'Project Tiger' in Cheetah Reintroduction in Kuno National Park, Madhya Pradesh at the cost of **Rs. 1057.04 Lakhs (Rupees One Thousand Fifty Seven Lakhs Four thousand Only)** as per details given in the table at Annexure. Of the total cost of the Scheme, **Rs. 185.27 Lakhs (Rupees One hundred Eighty Five lakhs Twenty Seven thousand Only)** being the recurring cost of the scheme will be shared on 50:50 basis by the **Government of India** and **Government of Madhya Pradesh.** The remaining cost of the scheme will be treated as 60% Central Assistance by the Government of India and 40% assistance by the State Government of Madhya Pradesh.

2. I am also directed to convey the sanction of the President to the payment and release of an amount of **Rs. 149.2925 lakhs (Rupees One Hundred Forty Nine lakhs Twenty Nine thousand Two Hundred fifty only)** as the 1st installment of Central Share towards the Grants-in-aid to Government of Madhya Pradesh during the current financial year 2022-23. The balance amount of the Central Assistance will be released in due course after a review of the progress of expenditure/work is undertaken.

3. The grants-in-aid will be regulated in accordance with the provisions contained in the memorandum of the Centrally Sponsored Project Tiger Scheme. The Grants-in-Aid is also subject to the Chapter 9 of the General Financial Rules 2017, as amended from time to time, read with the Government of India's decision incorporated there-under, and any other guidelines which may be issued in this regard, and in particular to the following conditions:-

i. Approval of the competent authority be obtained.

ii. The programme be monitored by PD regularly and the progress Report be obtained periodically.

- iii. The expenditure is incurred as per the allocation of funds.
- iv. Payments are made by bank transfer and no cash payment is to be made.
- v. Funds for POL/maintenance of vehicles would be admissible only for the vehicles purchased from CSS funds.

- vi. Compensation for loss due to wildlife is to supplement the State Govt fund as per the rules of State Govt.
- vii. GFR is followed by implementing agency along with the economic instructions issued by Government of India from time to time.
- viii. Evidence of deposit of GST in case of contract payment and leviable goods are obtained along with UC and compliance of DBT scheme has to be ensured.
- ix. In case of employment through contract, copy of PF & ESI contributions of employees shall be obtained, where able applicable.
- x. UC is to be submitted as prescribed in GFR 2017.
- xi. If the implementing agency does not use the fund for the purpose for which it was given, it has to refund the same with interest.
- xii. There should not be any overlapping of activities under the projects with the activities of ongoing scheme of Central/State Government.
- xiii. The fixed asset created out of this grant shall not be disposed off without approval of this Ministry.
- xiv. A separate bank account shall be opened for the purpose and the account shall be open for audit by Central Government of C&AG.
- xv. The UC with physical progress report and photo be obtained and uploaded on the website of the implementing agency as well as of the Ministry for public access.
- xvi. The State Government shall ensure compliance of instructions issued by Department of Expenditure, Ministry of Finance regarding procedure of release of funds and monitoring thereof.
- xvii. It shall be ensured that all unspent balance lying in the scheme at all levels is transferred to SNA account immediately. Further, the release of funds to child agencies is as per the procedure laid down in Department of Expenditure OM and CGA SoP so that there is complete transparency and fund is moved when released to the end beneficiary.

4. As the annual budget of the Scheme is approved by the Central Government, the Government of Madhya Pradesh is not required to furnish bond and sureties, in accordance with the Ministry of Finance O.M. No. 14(1)-EII (A)/64 dated 23.6.1965.

5. The payment sanctioned above is subject to the adjustment on the basis of the audited figures of expenditure. Other terms and conditions of the payment are as under:

- (a) The grant is in accordance with the pattern of financial assistance approved by the Ministry of Finance.
- (b) The grant sanctioned is subject to the adjustment on the basis of the terms and conditions approving the scheme.

6. No deviation from the approved items of expenditure as enumerated in the annexure shall be made without prior concurrence of the Government of India. The guidelines of National Tiger Conservation Authority should be fully adhered to. The Chief Wildlife Warden and the Principal Chief Conservator of Forests of the State Government should be directed to ensure that the field works are in accordance with the Tiger Conservation Plan and the Annual Plan of Operation by the field inspections from time to time.
