**Sub: Centrally Sponsored Scheme 'Project Tiger & Elephant' Administrative Approval for funds release to Government of Assam, during 2024-25 – 2<sup>nd</sup> instalment – reg.**

Sir,

I am directed to convey the administrative approval of the competent authority to the continuance of the Scheme 'Project Tiger & Elephant' in Assam at the cost of **₹4606.01 Lakh** (**₹ Four Thousand Six Hundred Six Lakh One Thousand Only**) as per details given in the table at **Annexure**.

2. I am also directed to convey the sanction of the President to the payment and release of an amount of **₹1316.33085 Lakh** (**₹ One Thousand Three Hundred Sixteen Lakh Thirty Three Thousand Eighty Five Only**) as the 2<sup>nd</sup> instalment of Central Share towards the Grants-in-aid to Government of Assam during the current financial year 2024-25. The balance amount of the Central Assistance will be released in due course after a review of the progress of expenditure/work is undertaken.

3. The grants-in-aid will be regulated in accordance with the provisions contained in the memorandum of the Centrally Sponsored Project Tiger & Elephant Scheme. The Grants-in-Aid is also subject to the Chapter 9 of the General Financial Rules 2017, as amended from time to time, read with the Government of India's decision incorporated there-under, and any other guidelines which may be issued in this regard, and in particular to the following conditions:-

- i. The expenditure is incurred as per the allocation of funds.
- ii. Payments are made by bank transfer and no cash payment is to be made.
- iii. Funds for POL/maintenance of vehicles would be admissible only for the vehicles purchased from CSS funds.
- iv. Compensation for loss due to wildlife is to supplement the State Govt. fund as per the rules of State Govt.
- v. Provisions of GFR is followed by implementing agency along with the economic instructions issued by Government of India from time to time.
- vi. Evidence of deposit of GST in case of contract payment and leivable goods are obtained along with UC and compliance of DBT scheme has to be ensured.
- vii. In case of employment through contract, copy of PF & ESI contributions of employees shall be obtained, where able applicable.
- viii. UC is to be submitted as prescribed in GFR 2017.

- ix. Interest accrued to be deposited in CFI.
- x. Activities should be undertaken as per approved guidelines of PT&E.
- xi. All relevant information and documents/certificates as required under GFR 209(I) have been received.
- xii. The pattern of assistance of rules governing such grants-in-aid have received the approval of the Ministry of Finance, as required under Government of India decision No. (1) under DFPR-Rules 20.
- xiii. Terms and conditions of the service of the employees employed under the **Project Tiger and Elephant Scheme** are not higher than those applicable to similar categories of employees of Central Government and where it is not in accordance with above, the relaxation of Ministry of Finance have been obtained for such discrepancies as required under GFR 230(12)(I).
- xiv. Assets acquired wholly or substantially out of Government Grants shall not be disposed off without obtaining the prior approval of the sanctioning authority of Grants-in-aid.
- xv. The **Government of Assam** agrees to make reservations for Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes or OBC in the posts or services under its control on the lines indicated by Govt. of India.
- xvi. The accounts of the **Project Tiger and Elephant Scheme** shall be audited by C&AG or by any person authorized by him on his behalf in accordance with the provisions laid down in Section 14 of the C&AG (DPC) Act, 1971 as amended from time to time.
- xvii. The accounts of the **Project Tiger and Elephant Scheme** shall be open for inspection by the sanctioning authority and audit, both by the Comptroller & Auditor General of India under the provision of C&AG (DPC) Act, 1971 and internal audit party by the Principal Accounts Office of the Ministry whenever it is called upon.
- xviii. The Utilization Certificate against the earlier funds released under Grants-in-aid have been received and accepted by the competent authority.
- xix. Government of Assam in respect of **Project Tiger and Elephant Scheme** may furnish their performance-cum-achievement report on or before 31.03.2025.
- xx. **Tiger/Elephant Reserves** will spend Grants-in-aid exclusively in pursuance of the objectives envisaged in rules/memorandum of the Centrally Sponsored Scheme 'Project Tiger & Elephant' and for the purpose it is being sanctioned.
- xxi. Grants-in-aid to **Government of Assam** is subject to the Economy Instructions issued from time to time by the Ministry of Finance or by the Competent Authority.
- xxii. Grants-in-aid shall be utilized before the end of the current financial year 2024-25 and unspent balance, if any, will be refunded by **Government of Assam** to the **Govt. of India**.
- xxiii. Government of Assam in respect of **Project Tiger and Elephant Scheme** will maintain a separate account and will present their annual accounts in the standard format as required under GFR 230(5).
- xxiv. Grants-in-aid shall be utilized for **Kaziranga, Orang, Nameri and Manas Tiger Reserve** strictly as per the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between the Ministry of Environment, Forests and Climate Change, acting through the National Tiger Conservation Authority, Field Director (**Kaziranga, Orang, Nameri and Manas Tiger Reserve**) and **Government of Assam**.
- xxv. Monitorable outcomes on the item of works contained in the sanction letter both in physical and financial terms are required to be furnished in the monthly report

- regularly. Compliance status on Tripartite Memorandum of Understanding is required before submission of additional or ensuing year's Annual Plan of Operation (APO).
- xxvi. The expenditure should be limited to the amount released and in no case should be done in anticipation of further release by the Ministry.
  - xxvii. The payments of daily wages should be done through DBT mode only (Rule 87 of GFR 2017).
  - xxviii. It may please be ensured that there is no duplication of nature and items of work being proposed in the same area under the **Centrally Sponsored Scheme of Project Tiger and Elephant** and other Centrally Sponsored Schemes such as Eco-development and IDWH Schemes etc.
  - xxix. The cost estimates worked out by the Field Director should be based on approved schedule of rates of the State Government, with due approval of the competent authority.
  - xxx. Approval of the competent authority be obtained and acceptance of UC may be ensured by PD.
  - xxxi. The expenditure is incurred as per the allocation of funds.
  - xxxii. Payments are made by bank transfer and no cash payment is to be made.
  - xxxiii. Funds for POL / maintenance of vehicles would be admissible only for the vehicles purchased from CSS funds.
  - xxxiv. Funds will not be diverted for any item other than specified herein.
  - xxxv. Funds to be spent only on items approved in Tiger Conservation Plan (TCP)/CSS Guidelines.
  - xxxvi. Compensation for loss due to wildlife is to supplement the State Government fund as per the rules of State Government.
  - xxxvii. GFR is followed by implementing agency alongwith the economic instructions issued by Government of India from time to time.
  - xxxviii. Satellite photo with date and latitude and longitude nodes after completion of work depicting the work carried out before and after the work.
  - xxxix. Evidence of deposit of TDS/Service Tax in case of contract payment and CST in case of leviable goods are sent along with UC.
  - xl. In case of employment through contract, copy of PF & ESI contributions of employees shall be obtained wherever applicable.
  - xli. All measurable outcome of this grant must be mentioned in the sanction order and UC is to be submitted as prescribed in GFR 2017 – Form GFR 12-C.
  - xlii. If the implementing agency does not use the fund for the purpose for which it was given, it has to refund the same with interest.
  - xliii. There should not be any overlapping of activities under the projects with the activities of ongoing schemes under CSS/CS/State Government Scheme.
  - xliv. The sanction order must mention measurable physical parameters and all measurable parameters are to be adhered to.
  - xlv. The fixed asset created out of this grant shall not be disposed off without concurrence of this Ministry.
  - xlii. All guidelines under the project is to be followed scrupulously.
  - xlvii. The UC with physical progress report and satellite photo with physical deliverable with date and latitude – longitude coordinates before and after completion of work be obtained of each tiger reserve and uploaded on the website of the implementing agency as well as the Ministry for public access.

- xlviii. The measurable outcome under the project (quantified) in terms of number of tigers/ elephants in reserves, eco-tourism in tiger/ elephant reserves, %age decrease in man-animal conflict etc., may also be submitted in the progress report.
- xlix. All labour payments strictly by Direct Benefit Transfer (DBT).
1. The guidelines of Project Tiger and Elephant Scheme are followed by **Tiger/Elephant Reserves** and Expenditure Evaluation Report on the expenditure incurred vis-à-vis proposed activities and result achieved may be furnished.

4. As the annual budget of the Scheme is approved by the Central Government, the Government of **Assam** is not required to furnish bond and sureties, in accordance with the Ministry of Finance O.M. No. 14(1)-EII (A)/64 dated 23.06.1965.

5. The terms and conditions of the payment are as under:

- a. The grant is in accordance with the pattern of financial assistance approved by the Ministry of Finance.
- b. The grant sanctioned is subject to the adjustment on the basis of the terms and conditions approving the scheme.

6. No deviation from the approved items of expenditure as enumerated in the annexure shall be made without prior concurrence of the Government of India. The guidelines of National Tiger Conservation Authority should be fully adhered to. The Chief Wildlife Warden and the Principal Chief Conservator of Forests of the State Government should be directed to ensure that the field works are in accordance with the Tiger Conservation Plan and the Annual Plan of Operation by the field inspections from time to time.

7. In accordance with the revised procedure, the Central Accounts Section, Reserve Bank of India, Nagpur, may kindly be advised to pass on credit to the books of the State Government of **Assam** under intimation to this Department.

8. The expenditure incurred is adjustable to the Demand No. 28 (Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change) under the following heads during the Financial Year 2024-25:

Anti-depredation squads are formed around the OTR comprising the fringe villages in dealing with the monitoring of straying wild animals and there is need to provide basic amenities such as torches, batteries, caps, tarpoleins etc. to the squads for ease of duty and adequate motivation.

OTR is surrounded by villages in its notified buffer. In light of Human-wildlife co-existence there is need for wildlife conservation campaign all around the OTR. Wildlife Week, World Tiger Day, World Rhino Day and other important Awareness Programmes headed by esteemed dignitaries.

Mandatory activity under S/33A of WLP 1972. The tiger reserve is surrounded on all sides by cattle population posing a great risk of spread of diseases in the wild. To prevent/ mitigate such disasters there is a need to ensure herd immunity among the cattle population by vaccinating them at least twice a year in 4 locations around the park.

The area of Orang National Park has been increased by 200.32 sq.km. as 2nd addition. Hence, the no. of van mazdoor is increased from 80 nos. to 90 nos. There are 90 number of personnel who have been engaged for smart patrolling, maintenance of departmental elephants, drivers, boatmen to substantiate the shortage of staff. As all the staff engaged are performing semi-skilled work of the park and as per the latest minimum wages for semi-skilled staff is Rs. 443/day.

Every camp of the 49 APCs needs to be painted on the interior and exterior once in 5 years for good maintenance of the camp and better work culture. There is need of repair in many camps due to damages caused by weather, wildlife and age of the buildings. This year a total of 6 anti-poaching camps are proposed for repairing, while washing & painting.

The kuccha roads of OTR are severely damaged during the monsoons as they are under the Brahmaputra and Dhangri rivers' flood water along with spells of swaminess. Hence they need dressing, earthfilling, jungle cutting and drain clearing for effective patrolling immediately post monsoons. So, out of 92 km of motorable kuccha road, 20km is proposed for the financial year 2024-25.

The kuchha road from Range HQ to Kheroni is very essential throughout the year. Currently to reach the Kheroni APC, the staff need to take another road outside the Park which takes lots of time. To mitigate this issue and to create direct communication for effective patrolling duty, this road needs to be repaired immediately.

Total road length is 25 km for this year proposed for maintanance for 6 kms (Providing sand, gravel, earth filling etc.)

OTR has a patrolling path network of 104 Km which are very crucial in securing the Tigers and One-Horned Rhinoceros of the Reserve. These patrolling path are used by the staff for foot and elephant patrolling expect during the monsoons where patrolling is done on country boat and these paths act as boatlines. Such crucial lifelines warrant maintenance through jungle cutting and dressing 2 times in a financial year. The patrolling paths are to be 3m in width to avoid sudden encounters of wild animals and to ensure the safety of staff.
