- I am directed to convey the sanction of the President to the payment and release of an amount of Rs. 85.10850 Lakhs (Rupees Eighty Five Lakh Ten Thousand Eight Hundred Fifty only) as the 1st installment of Centre Share towards the Grants-in-aid to the Government of Mizoram during the current financial year 2024-25. The balance of the Central Assistance will be released in due course after a review of the progress of expenditure/ work is undertaken.
- 3. The grants-in-aid will be regulated in accordance with the provisions contained in the memorandum of the Centrally Sponsored Project Tiger Scheme. The Grants-in-Aid is also subject to the Chapter 9 of the General Financial Rules 2017, as amended from time to time, read with the Government of India's decision incorporated there-under, and any other guidelines which may be issued in this regard, and in particular to the following conditions:
 - i. Interest accrued to be deposited in CFI before release of instalment.
 - ii. Payments are made by bank transfer and no cash payment is to be made.
 - iii. Proposed activities under APO should be undertaken as per approved Guidelines of PT and PE. The expenditure is incurred as per the allocation of funds
 - iv. Funds for POL/ maintenance of vehicles would be admissible only for the vehicles purchased from CSS funds.
 - GFR is followed by implementing agency alongwith the economic instructions issued V. by Government of India from time to time.
- Evidence of deposit of GST in case of contract payment and leviable goods are obtained vi. along with UC and compliance of DBT scheme has to be ensured.
- vii. In case of employment through contract, copy of PF & ESI contributions of employees shall be obtained wherever applicable.
- viii. UC is to be submitted as prescribed in GFR 2017.
- The programme be monitored by PD regularly and the progress Report be obtained ix. periodically.
